I – COMPRÉHENSION DE L'ÉCRIT (10 points)

Document A

- A. Duffy is talking to a group of men from **Ireland / Ulster** who have just **arrived** in the **United States**.
'Erin' ne peut pas être accepté dans ce contexte linguistique.

3 x 0,5 pt = 1,5 pt

- B. He is from **Ireland**.
He now lives in the **United States of America**.
He seems to **have succeeded in life**.
He's a **boss / foreman / has a business**.

4 pts

- C. 1. **Exiger une seule des deux réponses :**

- The men have to build a railway line / railroad.
- They must carry earth from a hill to a valley.

2. Working conditions: they will work **6 days** a week for **15 dollars**. It's very **hard work**.
Living conditions: they will **sleep in tents**, and be given plenty of **food** and **all the whiskey they can buy**.

Documents A, B and C

R. In all three documents, the Irish community seems to stick together and not necessarily open up to other cultures and opportunities. In certain cases, this has serious consequences on people's lives / has a negative impact on people's prospects.

- **Doc A:** The workers' sense of belonging to the Irish community limits their opportunities of finding a better job and may become a trap if they accept Duffy's deal.
- **Doc B:** The Irish community's connections are too limited to enable Irish immigrants to reach the standard of living they aspired to when they left Ireland.
- **Doc C:** Irish America aims at Irish American readers only. It informs about the community but does not seem to reach out / the community seems to be closed in on itself.
